Thank you for contacting Hamilton City Council regarding the Vaccine Mandate. Further to the email correspondence sent to you below, the following is provided for your information.

With regard to your concerns around the reduced library hours – it has been indicated that reduced hours are likely to occur in instances where there may be staff shortages due to COVID-19 i.e.: should staff themselves happen to fall ill, or be required to isolate (personally) – we may face issues with staffing. Therefore, library hours may need to be reduced.

Our overriding consideration is and will continue to be the safety of our workforce, volunteers, and the community (many of whom are more vulnerable to potential COVID-19 transmission) who use our services.
