5. Objection to the menacing classification of Basil from Christine Smith

Ms Smith spoke to her objection of the classification of her dog Basil as menacing. She outlined the incident from her point of view and her concerns in relation to the process. She responded to questions from Elected Members concerning the age of the dog, historic behaviour of the dog, injuries on the victim dog and the incident.

Adele Fraser (witness) then responded to questions from Elected Members concerning the incident and her written statement.

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The Animal Control Manager spoke to the report and highlighted the evidence that they had based the decision to classify Basil as menacing. Staff responded to questions from Elected Members concerning the incident, injuries on the victim dog, victim dog owner's statement and off leash dogs on leash required areas.

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# Purpose - Take

1. To seek a determination from the Dog Control Hearings Panel on the classification of M Rite (Dog Owner) as a disqualified dog owner.

# Staff Recommendation - Tuutohu-aa-kaimahi

- 2. That the Dog Control Hearings Panel:
  - a) receives the report;
  - b) confirms it has considered the mandatory matters specified under the <u>Dog Control Act</u> <u>1996</u>, and other matters relevant to the objection;
  - c) notes under the <u>Dog Control Act 1996</u> that the Dog Control Hearings Panel in determining any objection can only either:
    - i. uphold the classification;
    - ii. bring forward the date of termination of the classification; or
    - iii. immediately terminate the disqualification;

#### d) **EITHER**

i. classifies the Dog Owner as disqualified until 27 October 2027 (being the date that is 5 years from the date of the third or final infringement offence in respect of which the person is disqualified) and notes the right of the dog owner to appeal to the District Court under section 27 of the Dog Control Act 1996.

#### OR

ii. brings forward the date of termination of the classification to [a the date that is no more than 5 years from the date of the third or final infringement offence in respect of which the person is disqualified] and notes the right of the dog owner to appeal to the District Court under section 27 of the Dog Control Act 1996.

#### OR

iii. immediately terminates the classification.

# Executive Summary - Whakaraapopototanga matua

- 3. On 23 May 2023, M Rite (the Dog Owner) was classified by staff as disqualified from dog ownership **Attachment 1** is the Notice of Classification.
- 4. The trigger under the <u>Dog Control Act 1996</u> for the classification was the Dog Owner received three or more infringements in a 24-month period. Details of the infringements are further on in this report.
- 5. The Dog Control Act 1996 sets out the circumstances in which Council may classify a Dog Owner as disqualified.
- 6. The staff recommendation is that the Hearings Panel classify the Dog Owner as disqualified until 27 October 2027, being five years from the date of the last infringement offence in respect of which the Dog Owner is disqualified and notes the right of the Dog Owner to appeal to the District Court under section 27 of the Dog Control Act 1996.
- 7. Staff consider the decision in this report has low significance and that the recommendations comply with the Council's legal requirements.

# Background - Koorero whaimaarama

- 8. On 23 May 2023 the Dog Owner was classified by staff as disqualified from dog ownership, **Attachment 1** is the Notice of Classification. Due to a clerical error, the date of the end of the disqualification period was corrected from May 2028 to 27 October 2027 in a subsequent letter in **Attachment 1**.
- 9. The trigger under the <u>Dog Control Act 1996</u> for the classification was the Dog Owner received three or more infringements in a 24-month period. Details of the infringements are outlined later in this report.
- 10. Staff are satisfied that the circumstances of the offences and number of occurrences are such that disqualification is warranted, and classification of the Dog Owner as a probationary was not appropriate.
- 11. On 31 May 2023 an objection to the classification of the Dog Owner as disqualified was received by Council. Refer to **Attachment 2** for a copy of the objection. As a result, a hearing has been convened to hear the objection. The Hearing Panel should note the Owner has advised that they wish to be heard in person.
- 12. The normal order of the procedure of a hearing is as follows:
  - i. Opening of the meeting by the chairperson
  - ii. the Objector presents their objection and supporting evidence.
  - iii. Any witnesses in support of the objection speak to their evidence.
  - iv. The Complainant and any witnesses in opposition of the objection speak to their evidence.
  - v. Council staff summarise the Council report and makes any comments regarding information provided at the hearing
  - vi. The Objector has the opportunity to respond to any new matters or points not already covered during the hearing.
  - vii. The hearing is closed or adjourned for a decision to be made.

## 13. For the avoidance of doubt:

- i. The Chair of the hearing may change the order of the hearing at their discretion.
- ii. There is no opportunity for cross examination at the hearing by any party.
- iii. Members of the Hearings Panel may ask questions for clarification of the parties during the hearing.

# Discussion - Matapaki

- 14. Section 26 provides that in making its determination Council must have regard to:
  - the circumstances and nature of the offence or offences in respect of which the Dog Owner was classified;
  - ii. the competency of the person objecting in terms of responsible dog ownership;
  - iii. any steps taken by the owner to prevent further offences (including, but not limited to, the disposal of any dog or dogs or the fencing of the property on which the dog is kept);
  - iv. the matters advanced in support of the objection; and
  - v. any other relevant matters.

## Circumstances and nature of the offence(s) in respect of which the person was disqualified

- 15. In deciding to classify the Dog Owner, staff have relied on the following evidence:
  - i. Infringement offence # 1: The offence on 23 May 2022 was for failure to comply with Hamilton City Council bylaw in that both the owners' dogs were out roaming. An infringement was issued for each of the dog, INF# 13295 for Zephr and INF# 13296 for Runt.
  - ii. Infringement offence # 2: The offence on 23 June 2022 was for failure to comply with Hamilton City Council bylaw in that both the owners' dogs were out roaming. An infringement was issued for each of the dog, INF# 13328 for Zephr and INF# 13329 for Runt.
  - iii. Infringement offence # 3: The offence on 21 June 2022 was for failure to comply with Hamilton City Council bylaw in that both the owners' dogs were out roaming. An infringement was issued for each of the dog, INF# 13354 for Zephr and INF# 13355 for Runt.
  - iv. Infringement offence # 4: The offence on 28 July 2022 was for failure to comply with Hamilton City Council bylaw in that both the owners' dogs were out roaming. An infringement was issued for each of the dog, INF# 13532 for Zephr and INF# 13533 for Runt.
  - v. Infringement offence # 5: The offence on 11 August 2022 was for failure to comply with Hamilton City Council bylaw in that the dog Runt was out roaming resulting in INF# 13468 being issued.
  - vi. Infringement offence # 6: The offence on 18 September 2022 was for failure to comply with Hamilton City Council bylaw in that the dog Runt was out roaming resulting in **INF# 13545** being issued.
  - vii. Infringement offence #7: The offence on 28 October 2022 was for failure to keep dog controlled or confined in that the dog Zephr was free to leave and the owner seemed unable to contain or control her dog resulting in **INF# 12942** being issued. (Attachment 3 infringements)

## Matters advanced in support of the objection

- 16. To date no further information has been supplied to Animal Education and Control by the dog owner or her representative on the grounds for the objection to disqualification.
- 17. Refer to **Attachment 2** for the copy of the objection and **Attachment 3** for correspondence requesting more information.

## Steps taken by the Dog Owner to prevent any further offences

18. Staff are not aware of any steps taken by the Dog Owner to prevent any further offences. The Dog Owner may have further information on this matter at the hearing.

# The competency of the person objecting in terms of responsible dog ownership

- 19. Ownership history and recorded dog behaviour can be a relevant consideration if it provides evidence of prior good or poor dog ownership behaviour. Refer to **Attachment 5** for the infringement disqualification process.
- 20. The Dog Owner first came to the notice of Animal Education and Control (AEC) in March 2022 when her dogs were first reported out roaming.
- 21. Since then, AEC has received 16 complaints about these two dogs, the most recent being in June 2023 for which a further infringement was issued. The infringement from June 2023 was not part of this disqualification.
- 22. The 11 infringements that are part of this disqualification were all issued within a five-month period from May to October 2022 inclusive and are highlighted in blue in the table below.
- 23. Council has records of 16 complaints and/or infringements regarding dogs registered to the Owner as follows:

24. That the incidents occurred was not disputed by the Dog Owner. If a Dog Owner were to dispute the individual circumstances of an infringement, they would need to notify AEC that they wish to object within 28 days of receipt of the infringement and AEC will initiate the next steps. The Dog Owner did not contest or object to any of the infringements issued against her dogs.

## Other relevant matters

- 25. The <u>Dog Control Act 1996</u> requires consideration of any other matters that the Hearings Panel considers relevant.
- 26. Council's Dog Control Policy provides direction on how Council will fulfil its legislative responsibilities pursuant to the <u>Dog Control Act 1996</u> and the Dog Control Bylaw. The Hearing Panel should consider whether its decision is consistent with the purposes in the Dog Control Policy, specifically:
  - i. the need to minimise danger, distress, and nuisance to the community generally;
  - ii. the need to avoid the inherent danger in allowing dogs to have uncontrolled access to public places that are frequented by children, whether or not the children are accompanied by adults;
  - iii. the importance of enabling, to the extent that is practicable, the public (including families) to use streets and public amenities without fear of attack or intimidation by dogs;
  - iv. the exercise and recreational needs of dogs and their owners.

# **Options**

- 27. Under the <u>Dog Control Act 1996</u>, the Hearing Panel has limited options when considering an outcome of an objection to a decision to classify a Dog Owner as disqualified. The Hearing Panel may:
  - i. uphold the classification;
  - ii. bring forward the date of termination of the classification; or
  - iii. immediately terminate the disqualification.
- 28. There are no other options open to the Hearings Panel under the Dog Control Act 1996.

- 29. The staff recommendation is that the Hearings Panel upholds the classification of the Dog Owner as disqualified until 27 October 2027 being five years from the date of the third infringement offence(s) in respect of which the person is disqualified and notes the right of the dog owner to appeal to the District Court under section 27 of the Dog Control Act 1996.
- 30. Staff make this recommendation for the following reasons:
  - i. The number of offences committed over a short timeframe resulted in 11 infringements being issued over five months.
  - ii. The professional opinion of Animal Education and Control staff that the Dog Owner was either unwilling or unable to control or contain her dogs as evidenced by the large number of complaints for roaming and her own admission that her dogs do not listen to her.
  - iii. The Dog Owner's refusal to register her dogs until they were seized.
  - iv. That the dogs have in more recent complaints been described as aggressive. The more a dog is allowed to roam the bigger its territory gets, and this can result in territorial aggression being displayed and may include dog attacks on people or animals/dogs.
- 31. The professional opinion of Animal Education and Control staff is that the Dog Owner has shown little regard for the rights of community members to move around their community free from harm or harassment by dogs. Some complainants have noted that they are scared to walk in the area even though they live in the same street due to the dog's aggression. Legislative requirements have been ignored and only complied with when no other option is available to the Dog Owner e.g. registration compliance.
- 32. The professional opinion of Animal Education and Control staff is that M Rite is not a responsible dog owner.

#### Financial Considerations - Whaiwhakaaro Puutea

33. This is a regular operating activity funded through the Long-Term Plan.

# **Legal and Policy Considerations - Whaiwhakaaro-aa-ture**<u>Disqualified Classification</u>

- 34. <u>Section 25</u> of the <u>Dog Control Act 1996</u> provides that a territorial authority must classify a Dog Owner as disqualified if:
  - i. the person commits 3 or more infringement offences (not relating to a single incident or occasion) within a continuous period of 24 months; or
  - ii. the person is convicted of an offence (not being an infringement offence) against the Dog Control Act 1996; or
  - iii. the person is convicted of an offence against <u>Part 1</u> or <u>Part 2</u> of the Animal Welfare Act 1999, <u>section 26ZZP</u> of the Conservation Act 1987, or <u>section 56I</u> of the National Parks Act 1980.
- 35. This requirement does not apply if the territorial authority is satisfied that the circumstances of the offence or offences are such that:
  - i. disqualification is not warranted; or
  - ii. the territorial authority staff will instead classify the person as a probationary owner under section 21.

## Effect of classification as a disqualified owner

- 36. A disqualification under the <u>Dog Control Act 1996</u> continues in force for a period specified by the territorial authority not exceeding five years from the date of the third infringement offence(s) in respect of which the person is disqualified.
- 37. The disqualified owner must:

- within 14 days dispose of every dog owned by the person; and
- not be in possession of a dog at any time (there are some limited exceptions to this).
- 38. The disqualification extends over all of New Zealand.

#### Right to make an objection

- 39. <u>Section 26</u> provides a Dog Owner with the right to object to Council, to the classification as disqualified.
- 40. An objection under <u>Section 26</u> may be lodged at any time but no objection can be lodged within 12 months of the hearing of any previous objection to the disqualification.
- 41. The territorial authority must, as soon as practicable, give written notice to the owner of:
  - its determination of the objection;
  - the reasons for its determination; and
  - the right of appeal to the District Court under section 27.

# Appeal to the District Court

- 42. Any person who has lodged an objection under <u>section 26</u> and is dissatisfied with the decision of the territorial authority may, within 14 days of the date on which notice of that decision is given to that person, appeal to the District Court against that decision.
- 43. The District Court, in hearing the appeal, shall consider the matters specified in <a href="section 26(3)">section 26(3)</a> and any submission by the territorial authority in support of its decision, and may uphold the determination, bring forward the date of termination, or immediately terminate the disqualification.

# Wellbeing Considerations - Whaiwhakaaro-aa-oranga tonutanga

- 44. The purpose of Local Government changed on the 14 May 2019 to include promotion of the social, economic, environmental and cultural wellbeing of communities in the present and for the future ('the 4 wellbeings').
- 45. The subject matter of this report has been evaluated in terms of the 4 wellbeings during the process of developing this report as outlined below.
- 46. Staff consider that the keeping of animals can enhance the quality of life and wellbeing for individuals and families; however, the Council also has a responsibility to protect the community from unreasonable animal nuisances families, whanau, iwi, hapuu, and communities should be safe from dangerous animals.

#### Risks - Tuuraru

- 47. Public safety risk: If a dog owner that should have been classified is not, their behaviour may mean that animals in their possession may continue to pose a potential threat to the public or other animals. This could result in attacks or incidents that cause harm.
- 48. Reputation and perception: Failure to properly classify a dog owner may affect the public perception of Council's approach to enforcement.

49. Staff have considered the key considerations under the Significance and Engagement Policy and have assessed that the recommendation(s) in this report has/have a low level of significance.

## EFFECT OF DISQUALIFICATION Section 28, Dog Control Act 1996

You are required to dispose of every dog owned by you within 14 days of the date of this notice.

However, you may not dispose of a dog-

- to a person who resides at the same address as you; or
- in a way that constitutes an offence against the Dog Control Act 1996 or any other Act.

You must not become the owner, even on a temporary basis, of any dog while you are disqualified. You may have possession of a dog only for the purpose of-

- · preventing it from causing injury, damage, or distress; or
- returning, within 72 hours, a lost dog to a territorial authority for the purpose of restoring the dog to its owner.

You will commit an offence and be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding \$3,000 if you-

- fail to dispose of every dog owned by you within 14 days of this notice; or
- at any time while disqualified, become the owner of any dog; or
- dispose of a dog owned by you-
- to a person who resides at the same address as you; or
- in a manner that constitutes an offence against the Dog Control Act 1996 or any other Act.

If you are convicted of the first or second of these offences, your period of disqualification may be further extended.

You will also commit an offence and be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding \$3,000 if you dispose or give custody or possession of a dog to a person knowing that person to be disqualified from ownership under section 25 of the Dog Control Act 1996.

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## Disqualification from dog ownership

#### Disqualification triggers

Conviction under any of the following Acts

- Dog Control Act 1996
- Animal Welfare Act 1999
- Conservation Act 1987
- · National Parks Act 1980 or
- The person commits 3 or more separate infringement offences in a 24 month period (note: infringement related disqualification may only occur after the infringements have been paid or if unpaid laid in court)

#### Infringement Process

#### Dog owner issued an infringement as the result of an offence under the Dog Control Act 1996

- Infringement is to be paid within 28 days of the date of issue, the date of issue used is approximately 1 week after postage date e.g. infringement being posted on 15<sup>th</sup> of the month will have an issue date of 22<sup>nd</sup> of the month, this is to take into account postal delivery times.
  - An infringement is only issued at the end of an investigation and how soon after the event it is
    issued will depend on the event complexity.
  - Animal Education and Control have 6 months from the date of the offence to issue an infringement and lay it in Court.

#### Reminder letter sent

#### (INF issued - reminder 6-8 weeks)

- Approximately 6-8 weeks after the infringement is issued a reminder letter is posted to anyone whose infringement remains unpaid.
  - A further 28 days is allowed for payment of the infringement, plus some additional time to consider postal delivery times.

#### Laid in Court

#### (Reminder - Laid in Court 6-8 weeks)

- A further 6-8 weeks after the reminder letter has been sent any unpaid infringements are laid in Court.
  - From the conclusion of an investigation, an infringement being issued and then being laid in court can take 4-5 months.
  - This process is followed for any subsequent infringements a dog owner may incur.

# (Completion of infringement process 4-5 months)

#### Disqualification documentation created and delivered (if dog owner committed has 3 or more infringement offences)

• Once an infringement process has been completed Animal Education and Control admin staff create the documentation and arrange its service by one of the Animal Education and Control Officers.

# Purpose - Take

- 1. To seek a determination from the Dog Control Hearings Panel on the classification of the dog Choc owned by J Rivers (Dog Owner) as:
  - i. a menacing dog because of the observed or reported behaviour of the dog pursuant to section 33A of the Dog Control Act 1996; and
  - ii. a menacing dog because the territorial authority has reasonable grounds to believe the dog belongs wholly or predominantly to one or more breeds or types listed in Schedule 4, specifically American Pit Bull Terrier pursuant to section 33C of the Dog Control Act 1996.

#### Staff Recommendation - Tuutohu-aa-kaimahi

- 2. That the Dog Control Hearings Panel:
  - a) receives the report;
  - b) confirms it has considered the mandatory matters specified under the Dog Control Act 1996, and other matters relevant to the objection;
  - c) notes that the Dog Control Hearings Panel in determining any objection can only either uphold or rescind the classification under the Dog Control Act 1996; and
  - d) upholds **OR** rescinds the menacing classification because Council has reasonable grounds to believe the dog belongs wholly or predominantly to one or more breeds or types listed in Schedule 4, specifically American Pit Bull Terrier pursuant to section 33C of the Dog Control Act 1996; and
  - e) upholds **OR** rescinds the menacing classification because of the observed or reported behaviour of the dog pursuant to section 33A of the Dog Control Act 1996.

# Executive Summary - Whakaraapopototanga matua

- 3. On 20 February 2023 Council received a complaint regarding Choc and Milo (deceased), two brown American Pit Bull Cross type dogs. **Attachment 1** contains the investigation undertaken by staff.
- 4. The Dog Control Act 1996 sets out the circumstances in which Council may classify a dog as menacing.
- 5. Staff recommend that Council:

- i. upholds the classification of Choc as menacing because Council has reasonable grounds to believe the dog belongs wholly or predominantly to one or more breeds or types listed in Schedule 4, specifically American Pit Bull Terrier pursuant to section 33C of the Dog Control Act 1996; and
- ii. upholds the classification of Choc as menacing because of the observed or reported behaviour of the dog pursuant to section 33A of the Dog Control Act 1996.
- 6. Staff consider the decision in this report has low significance and that the recommendations comply with the Council's legal requirements.

# Background - Kooreo whaimaarama

- 7. The complaint broadly involved:
  - Two roaming dogs sighted outside Northolt Street; both were described as brown Pit Bulls by a complainant. The complainant thought the dogs might have come from Northolt Street as they kept going down that driveway.
- 8. **Attachment 1** contains the investigation undertaken by staff. Key points of the investigation include:
  - i. Animal Education and Control Officers D45 and D40 initially attended the job. Both dogs were sighted out, one older dog had a collar, and the younger dog did not. The dogs appeared to be attempting to get back into the property they were from.
  - ii. D40 called for back-up as both dogs were displaying what the officers described as "significant aggression". D37 and D44 attended to assist with the dogs.
  - iii. The younger dog was caught on a catchpole and placed in the Animal Education and Control vehicle.
  - iv. The older dog went through a hole in the fence at the side rear of neighbouring drive and entered the house through an open back door. Knowing the dog could jump through the fence and leave again Officers have climbed the fence and shut the door, containing the dog inside the house.
  - v. A seizure notice has been left on the front door and the Officers have then returned to the Animal Education and Control Facility and impounded the younger dog kennel record 50451.
  - vi. The younger dog "Milo" was collected from the pound on 23 February 2023.
  - vii. After a number of attempts the investigating officer managed to contact the dog owner to inform him of the decision for Choc and Milo being classification as menacing.
- On 13 April 2023 the Dog "Choc" was classified by staff as menacing under sections 33A (observed behaviour) and 33C (breed/type) of the Dog Control Act 1996. Refer to Attachment 2 for the Notices of Classification. This report is only regarding the classification of "Choc" as the Dog Owner informed Animal Education and Control that "Milo" died in March 2023.
- 10. On 17 April 2023 initial correspondence was received regarding the classification of Choc, information provided, and confirmation of an objection was received on 20 June 2023 from the Dog Owner. Refer to **Attachment 3** for a copy of the objection.
- 11. As a result, a hearing has been convened to hear the objection. The Hearing Panel should note:
  - i. The Owners have advised that they do wish to be heard in person.
  - ii. The Complainant has advised that they do wish to be heard in person.
  - iii. The one witness does wish to be heard in person.
- 12. The normal order of the procedure of a hearing is as follows:
  - i. Opening of the meeting by the chairperson.

- ii. the Objector presents their objection and supporting evidence.
- iii. Any witnesses in support of the objection speak to their evidence.
- iv. The Complainant and any witnesses in opposition of the objection speak to their evidence.
- v. Council staff summarise the council report and makes any comments regarding information provided at the hearing.
- vi. The hearing can be resolved to move into a public excluded session (section 48(1)(a) of the Local Government Official Information and Meetings Act 1987 and the particular interest or interests protected by Section 7(2)(f)(ii) to maintain the effective conduct of public affairs through protecting persons from improper pressure or harassment) for a decision to be made.

#### 13. For the avoidance of doubt:

- i. The Chair of the hearing may change the order of the hearing at their discretion.
- ii. There is no opportunity for cross examination at the hearing by any party.
- iii. Members of the Hearings Panel may ask questions for clarification of the parties during the hearing.

# **Discussion - Matapaki**

- 14. Section 33B provides that in making its determination Council **must** have regard to:
  - i. the evidence which formed the basis for the classification;
  - ii. any steps taken by the owner to prevent any threat to the safety of persons or animals;
  - iii. the matters relied on in support of the objection; and
  - iv. any other relevant matters.
- 15. In relation to the classification of Choc as menacing the dog belongs wholly or predominantly to one or more breeds or types listed in Schedule 4, specifically American Pit Bull Terrier, if an owner objects to the classification, they must provide evidence that the dog is not of a breed or type listed in Schedule 4.

## **Evidence which formed the basis for the classification**

- 16. In deciding to classify the Dog, staff have relied on the following evidence:
  - The witness statements from the four Animal Education and Control Officers who attended the complaint and observed the aggressive behaviour displayed. [Refer attachment 4]
  - ii. The statement by the Dog Owner when contacted by phone by Animal Education and Control Officers who noted the aggression of the dogs that he (the Dog Owner) "trained them to be like that, they're guard dogs". [Refer attachment 1]
  - iii. The animal record for "Choc" which lists his primary breed as American Pit Bull Terrier, a type of dog requiring menacing classification under schedule 4 of the Dog Control Act 1996, and the two most recently received signed registration renewals. [Refer attachment 5]
  - iv. The Officer's notes and photos contained in CRM 311347/2023 and their professional opinion that Choc is predominantly an American Pit Bull Terrier type of dog. [Referattachment 1]

#### Matters relied on or advanced in support of the objection

17. The Dog Owner objects to the classification on the ground that they have had Choc since he was six weeks old, and he is now eight years old and during that time he has only shown aggression once when the owner was attacked in town. [Refer Attachment 6]

18. The Dog Owner has not to date provided any evidence to support an objection to the classification of Choc as menacing because the dog belongs wholly or predominantly to one or more breeds or types listed in Schedule 4, specifically American Pit Bull Terrier. This information is required for an objection to be made and succeed.

## Steps taken by the owner to prevent any threat to the safety of persons or animals

- 19. The Dog Owner has taken the following steps to prevent any threat to the safety of persons or animals:
  - They have fixed the hole in the fence, as noted the Officer's job notes. [Refer Attachment 1]

#### **Other relevant matters**

- 20. The Dog Control Act 1996 requires consideration of any other matters that the Hearings Panel considers relevant.
- 21. Council's Dog Control Policy provides direction on how Council will fulfil its legislative responsibilities pursuant to the <u>Dog Control Act 1996</u> and the Dog Control Bylaw. The Hearing Panel should consider whether its decision is consistent with the purposes in the Dog Control Policy, specifically:
  - i. the need to minimise danger, distress, and nuisance to the community generally;
  - ii. the need to avoid the inherent danger in allowing dogs to have uncontrolled access to public places that are frequented by children, whether or not the children are accompanied by adults;
  - iii. the importance of enabling, to the extent that is practicable, the public (including families) to use streets and public amenities without fear of attack or intimidation by dogs; and
  - iv. the exercise and recreational needs of dogs and their owners.
- 22. Ownership history and recorded dog behaviour can be a relevant consideration if it provides evidence of prior good or poor dog or ownership behaviour.
- 23. Council has two prior complaints relating to Choc, one in 2017 and one in 2019, neither of which has any significant relevance for the subject of this report.

## **Options**

- 24. Under the <u>Dog Control Act 1996</u>, territorial authorities have two options when considering an outcome of an objection to a dog being classified as menacing:
  - i. to uphold the classification; or
  - ii. to rescind the classification.
- 25. There are no other options open to the Dog Control Hearings Panel under the <u>Dog Control Act</u> <u>1996</u>.
- 26. The staff recommendation is **option 1** that the Hearings Panel uphold the classification for the following reasons:
  - i. Animal Education and Control staff believe the dog Choc may pose an ongoing risk due to the level of aggression witnessed by staff on the day he was out roaming.
  - ii. The only way to reduce the potential risk of an attack is to ensure containment and to muzzle him in public.
  - iii. Muzzling can only be enforced under the menacing and dangerous classifications of the Dog Control Act 1996.
  - iv. As Choc is registered American Pit Bull Terrier/Labrador cross, it is a requirement of the Dog Control Act 1996 that he be classified as menacing.

#### Financial Considerations - Whaiwhakaaro Puutea

27. This is a regular operating activity funded through the Long-Term Plan.

# Legal and Policy Considerations - Whaiwhakaaro-aa-ture Menacing Dog Classification

- 28. Section 33C of the Dog Control Act 1996 provides that a territorial authority **must**, for the purposes of section 33E(1)(a), classify as menacing any dog that the territorial authority has reasonable grounds to believe belongs wholly or predominantly to 1 or more breeds or types listed in Schedule 4.
- 29. Section 33A of the Dog Control Act 1996 provides that a territorial authority may classify dog as menacing that has not been classified as a dangerous dog under section 31; but a territorial authority considers may pose a threat to any person, stock, poultry, domestic animal, or protected wildlife because of
  - i. any observed or reported behaviour of the dog; or
  - ii. any characteristics typically associated with the dog's breed or type.

#### Council's Dog Control Policy - Neutering of dogs classified as menacing

- 30. Council's Dog Control Policy provides direction on how Council will fulfil its legislative responsibilities pursuant to the <u>Dog Control Act 1996</u> and the Dog Control Bylaw.
- 31. The <u>Dog Control Policy</u> requires mandatory neutering of dogs classified as menacing in accordance with the provisions of the <u>Dog Control Act 1996</u>. Mandatory neutering also includes dogs classified as menacing by other territorial authorities where that dog is in the jurisdiction of Hamilton City Council.

#### Right to make an objection

- 32. Section 33B provides a dog owner with the right to object to the classification. If a dog is classified under section 33A as a menacing dog, the owner:
  - i. may, within 14 days of receiving notice of the classification, object in writing to the territorial authority in regard to the classification; and
  - ii. has the right to be heard in support of the objection.

Additionally, if an owner objects to the menacing dog classification under section 33C, they **must** provide evidence that the dog is not of a breed or type listed in Schedule 4 (Section 33D).

- 33. The territorial authority considering an objection under subsection (1) may uphold or rescind the classification, and in making its determination must have regard to
  - i. the evidence which formed the basis for the classification; and
  - ii. any steps taken by the owner to prevent any threat to the safety of persons or animals; and
  - iii. the matters relied on in support of the objection; and
  - iv. any other relevant matters.
- 34. The territorial authority must, as soon as practicable, give written notice to the owner of
  - i. its determination of the objection; and
  - ii. the reasons for its determination.

# Wellbeing Considerations - Whaiwhakaaro-aa-oranga tonutanga

Item (

- 35. The purpose of Local Government changed on the 14 May 2019 to include promotion of the social, economic, environmental and cultural wellbeing of communities in the present and for the future ('the 4 wellbeings').
- 36. The subject matter of this report has been evaluated in terms of the 4 wellbeings during the process of developing this report as outlined below.
- 37. Staff consider that the keeping of animals can enhance the quality of life and wellbeing for individuals and families; however, the Council also has a responsibility to protect the community from unreasonable animal nuisances families, whanau, iwi, hapuu, and communities should be safe from dangerous animals.

#### Risks - Tuuraru

- 38. Public safety risk: If a dog that should have been classified as menacing is not, it may continue to pose a potential threat to the public or other animals. This could result in attacks or incidents that cause harm. Failure to properly classify a dog as menacing could put public safety at risk.
- 39. Reputation and perception: Failure to properly classify a dog as menacing may affect the public perception of Council's approach to enforcement.

# Significance & Engagement Policy - Kaupapa here whakahira/anganui Significance

40. Staff have considered the key considerations under the Significance and Engagement Policy and have assessed that the recommendation(s) in this report has/have a low level of significance.

#### **Engagement**

41. Given the low level of significance determined, the engagement level is low. No engagement is required.





# Classification of Dog as Menacing Dog Section 33A Dog Control Act 1996

Section 33A of the Dog Control Act 1996 ("DCA") enables Hamilton City Council ("HCC"), to classify a dog that it considers poses a threat to any person, stock, poultry, domestic animal, or protected wildlife because of:

- a. any observed or reported behaviour of the dog; or
- b. any characteristics typically associated with the dog's breed or type.

As a result of the observed or reported behaviour HCC has classified the dog as a Menacing Dog under s33A of the Dog Control Act 1996. The Notice of Classification of Dog as Menacing Dog ("the Notice") is <u>enclosed</u>.

HCC requires you to have the dog de-sexed, and to provide a copy of the de-sexing certificate to HCC within one month from the date shown on the Notice.

You may be able to take advantage of discounts available through HCC for de-sexing fees with a contracted veterinarian. Microchipping is also available at the Animal Education and Control Centre. If you would like further information about these services, please contact the Animal Education and Control team on 838 6632.

Please ensure that you comply with the requirements of the classification within the timeframes outlined in the enclosed Notice to avoid any further enforcement action. If you do not agree with the Classification you may object in writing within 14 days of receiving the Classification. You must have valid ground for an objection and produce evidence that your dog is not of a breed or type listed above.

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# Notice of Classification of Dog as Menacing Dog

Section 33A, Dog Control Act 1996

To: \* (name of owner)

Male, Unneutered American Pit Bull Terrier x Labrador Retriever, Brown in colour, Named CHOC, Aged 8 years and 3 months approximately, Microchip

This is to notify you\* that this dog has been classified as a menacing dog under section 33A(2) of the Dog Control Act 1996.

This is because of the aggressive behavior displayed by the dog on Monday, 20th February 2023, in Hamilton

A summary of the effect of the classification and your right to object is provided below.

Animal Education and Control Manager

\* For the purposes of the Dog Control Act 1996, you are the owner of a dog if:-

you own the dog; or

- you have the dog in your possession (otherwise than for a period not exceeding 72 hours for the purpose of preventing the dog causing injury, damage, or distress, or for the sole purpose of restoring a lost dog to its owner); or
- you are the parent or guardian of a person under 16 who is the owner of the dog and who
  is a member of your household living with and dependent on you.

#### S 33E(1) Effect of classification as a menacing dog

Sections 33E, 33F, 36A, Dog Control Act 1996

You -

- (a) must not allow the dog to be at large or in any public place or in any private way (other than when confined completely within a vehicle or cage) without the dog being muzzled in such a manner as to prevent the dog from biting but to allow it to breathe and drink without obstruction; and
- (b) must produce to HCC within 1 month after receipt of this notice, a certificate issued by a veterinary surgeon certifying —
  - (i) that the dog is or has been neutered; or
  - that for reasons that are specified in the certificate, the dog will not be in a fit condition to be neutered before a date specified in the certificate; and

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(c) must, if a certificate under paragraph (b)(ii) is produced to HCC, produce to HCC, within 1 month after the date specified in that certificate, a further certificate under paragraph (b)(i).

You will commit an offence and be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding \$3,000 if you fail to comply with all of the matters in paragraphs (a) to (c) above.

A dog control officer or dog ranger may seize and remove the dog from you if you fail to comply with all of the matters in paragraphs (a) to (c) above. The officer or ranger may keep the dog until you demonstrate that you are willing to comply with paragraphs (a) to (c).

You are also required, for the purposes of providing permanent identification of the dog, to arrange for the dog to be implanted with a functioning microchip transponder. This must be confirmed by making the dog available to HCC in accordance with the reasonable instructions of HCC for verification that the dog has been implanted with a functioning microchip transponder of the prescribed type and in the prescribed location.

You will commit an offence and be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding \$3,000 if you fail to comply with this requirement within 2 months after the dog is classified as menacing.

If the dog is in the possession of another person (for a period not exceeding 72 hours), you must advise that person of the requirement to not allow the dog to be at large or in any public place or in any private way (other than when confined completely within a vehicle or cage) without the dog being muzzled in such a manner as to prevent the dog from biting but to allow it to breathe and drink without obstruction. # Classification of Dog as Menacing Dog Section 33C Dog Control Act 1996

Section 33C of the Dog Control Act 1996 requires Hamilton City Council ("HCC") to classify as menacing any dog that HCC has reasonable grounds to believe belongs wholly or predominantly to one or more breeds or types listed in Schedule 4 of the Dog Control Act

This means that all dogs of the American Pitbull Terrier **type**, or of the Brazilian Fila, Dogo Argentino, Japanese Tosa or Perro de Presa Canario breed must be classified as menacing. The word **type** is important, it means that if your dog has American Pitbull Terrier characteristics then it is required by law to be classified.

The Notice of Classification is <u>enclosed</u>. It is important to note that your dog's previous or current behaviour has no bearing on this classification.

You may be able to take advantage of discounts available through HCC for de-sexing fees with a contracted veterinarian. Microchipping is also available at the Animal Education and Control Centre. If you would like further information about these services, please contact the Animal Education and Control team on 838 6632.

Please ensure that you comply with the requirements of the classification within the timeframes outlined in the enclosed Notice to avoid any further enforcement action. If you do not agree with the Classification you may object in writing within 14 days of receiving the Classification. You must have valid grounds for an objection and produce evidence that your dog is not of a breed or type listed above.

This is because Hamilton City Council ("HCC") has reasonable grounds to believe that the dog belongs wholly or predominantly to one or more breeds or types listed in Schedule 4 of the Dog Control Act 1996, in this case an American Pit Bull Terrier x Labrador Retriever.

A summary of the effect of the classification and your right to object is provided below.

Animal Education and Control Manager

For the purposes of the Dog Control Act 1996, you are the owner of a dog if:-

you own the dog; or

- you have the dog in your possession (otherwise than for a period not exceeding 72 hours for the purpose of preventing the dog causing injury, damage, or distress, or for the sole purpose of restoring a lost dog to its owner); or
- you are the parent or guardian of a person under 16 who is the owner of the dog and who
  is a member of your household living with and dependent on you.

# S 33E(1) Effect of classification as a menacing dog

Sections 33E, 33F, 36A, Dog Control Act 1996

You -

- (a) must not allow the dog to be at large or in any public place or in any private way (other than when confined completely within a vehicle or cage) without the dog being muzzled in such a manner as to prevent the dog from biting but to allow it to breathe and drink without obstruction; and
- (b) must within produce to HCC within 1 month after receipt of this notice, a certificate issued by a veterinary surgeon certifying —
  - (i) that the dog is or has been neutered; or

You are also required, for the purposes of providing permanent identification of the dog, to arrange for the dog to be implanted with a functioning microchip transponder. This must be confirmed by making the dog available to HCC in accordance with the reasonable instructions of HCC for verification that the dog has been implanted with a functioning microchip transponder of the prescribed type and in the prescribed location.

You will commit an offence and be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding \$3,000 if you fail to comply with this requirement within 2 months after the dog is classified as menacing.

If the dog is in the possession of another person (for a period not exceeding 72 hours), you must advise that person of the requirement to not allow the dog to be at large or in any public place or in any private way (other than when confined completely within a vehicle or cage) without the dog being muzzled in such a manner as to prevent the dog from biting but to allow it to breathe and drink without obstruction. You will commit an offence and be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding \$500 if you fail to comply with this requirement.

Statement from Animal Control Officer D45.

Regarding Northolt Road, Hamilton.

On the 20th February 2023 at approximately 1:45pm, after receiving a report of two brown Pitt Bull type dogs roaming around Northolt Road, D40 and I have patrolled the area and seen two dogs, matching the description in the job, lying under a tree on the grass verge outside Northolt Road.

Upon exiting the vehicle, the dogs have seen us and have gone to the front door of the house at Northolt Road appearing to be trying to get inside the house. They have both started running around in an attempt to find a way back into the yard.

D40 has approached the front door of the house to rouse any occupant. While on the front step, the older male dog has rushed at D40 aggressively, forcing D40 to use his catch pole to fend the dog off.

Both dogs have continued to rush forward towards us in an aggressive manner, growling, teeth bared and lunging at us.

We have contacted AEC admin and obtained dog owner details for the address, and I have tried contacting the dog owner with no answer. We have retreated to the vehicle and called for backup from colleagues.

Approximately 15-20 minutes later, D37 and D44 have arrived. At this time, the dogs were lying under the yucca trees at the front of the property, free to leave. Once all four officers have approached, both dogs have started rushing forwards towards us, again growling, lunging, and snarling at us.

D40 and I have focused on the younger dog, while D37 and D44 have focused on the older dog. D40 has managed to capture the young dog on a catching pole and placed him in a vehicle.

We have then followed D37 and D44 down the long driveway to the house behind, where they saw the older dog jump through a hole in the fence into the back yard of Northolt Road. The dog has then entered the house through the back door which was open.

A neighbour has informed us that the other dog at the property was aggressive too and that the dogs were out often.

As we were aware that this dog could jump back out of the property and be free to leave again, D44 and D40 have jumped the fence into the back yard and closed the door of the house containing the dog inside.

We have all then left the property and impounded the young dog which required poling out of the vehicle and into the kennels due to its aggression.

l, state:

- 1. My full name is Justin I am an Animal Education and Control Officer for Hamilton City Council, and I have held this role since August 2022. My designation is D40.
- 2. On the 20th of February 2023, around 1.45pm, my colleague D45 was given a job about two dogs roaming on Northolt Road, outside the properties of and Northolt Road, which I attended with her.
- 3. As we patrolled Northolt Road we could see two brown, male, Pitbull crosses lying under a tree on the grass verge outside Northolt Road. We called our admin team, and they gave us the contact details for the owner of "Choc" the older of the two dogs, we had no record for the younger dog at the property. D45 tried phoning the dog owner but couldn't get hold of him.
- 4. The front of the property wasn't fenced, and the dogs looked like they couldn't get into the back section. As we left our vehicle and approached the dogs they barked and rushed at us aggressively. I attempted to get to the front door to knock to see if someone was home, and at this point both dogs came rushing at me and snarling, with "Choc" getting close enough to me that I had to use my catching pole to fend him off.
- 5. I called for back up and D45 and I have waited by our vehicle until D37 and D44 have arrived to assist. The dogs have backed off as we approached them but continued to bark and snarl at us. D45 and I have managed to get the younger dog on a catching pole whilst D37 and D44 have followed "Choc" down the driveway of Northolt Rd.
- 6. We've contained the younger dog in our vehicle and gone down the driveway of Northolt Rd to assist D37 and D44. They have told us that "Choc" has gone through a gap in the fence that backs onto Northolt Rd and is now back in his section.
- 7. As we know "Choc" can get out of his section, D44 and I have gone into the back section of Northolt Rd, where "Choc" was now inside the house. I have pulled the back door closed so "Choc" was securely contained.
- 8. We have left a seizure notice on the front door for the younger dog. And made our way back to the AECU where we have impounded the younger dog.

This statement is true to the best of my knowledge and belief. It has been made by me knowing that it may be admitted as evidence in court proceedings and that I could be prosecuted for making a statement known by me to be false and intended by me to mislead.

Myself and officer D37 were called by D40 and D45 to assist them at a address where they were attending a call for 2 dogs free to leave their property.

D37 and I arrived and have sighted the 2 dogs (both are brown Pit bull type dogs), on the front of the property D40 and D37 were at the front of the house on the footpath keeping them from leaving. As we approached, I could see the dogs, they were both barking at officers and when approached were acting in an aggressive manor.

We have approached the dogs to attempt to remove them, as we approached them they reacted more aggressively barking and snarling and coming forward at us.

D40 has managed to pole one of the dogs and put it into the ute. The second dog has run to the next-door driveway, entering the rear address. We have followed the dog into the property and lost sight of it. We spoke to the residents who told us the dog had gone to the corner of the property and can get through back into their property, The residents told us the dogs come and go through the fence, we looked but could not see where the dog had got through as it was all overgrown with vine.

We have gone back to the front of the dogs' address and could hear the dog barking from inside the house. We have had a discussion about what to do, D40 and myself went into the property, we have seen that the rear door to the house was open. D40 has hooked the door handle with a catch pole and pulled the door shut then we have left.

My full name is a second of the Animal Control Officers for Hamilton City Council.

On the 20th February 2023 at approximately 2pm I have attended the address of Northolt Road, Hamilton with Dog control officer D44.

Dog control officer D40 had called us to request back up as herself and Dog control officer D45 were working with 2 aggressive dogs loose in the street.

When we have arrived, the dogs have been on the front of the property of Northolt Road. There is no fencing at the front of the property, the dogs were free to leave.

On exiting my vehicle, the dogs have reacted to the movement by coming forward towards the footpath. I have joined my colleagues on the footpath outside the address. While we were talking and planning to contain the dogs, the 2 dogs have come rushing forward towards us, barking growling, and lunging in a very aggressive manner.

Myself and my 3 colleagues have had our catch poles for safety and have managed to get the dogs to move back towards the front door of the property. The younger dog has been put on a catch pole by D40.

The older dog has run off down the driveway of the property behind the address, it has gone through a hole in the fencing between the properties. Residents have told us that the dogs have been out before and are aggressive.

As the dog had entered the property through the hole, we knew that it would be able to exit it again if we left it in the property. We needed to secure the dog in a way we knew it would be safe from exiting again.

D40 and D44 have gone into the rear of the property, the dog went inside the open door at the rear of the house. D40 closed the door to secure the dog. We have then left the address.

The dogs were both brown Pitbull type dogs, 1 young dog and 1 older dog.



I had Choc since he was 6weeks old i got him registered at 3months old he is now 8years old ...he has be a loyal friend to me and my friends and family never shown aggression only one time when he was 3years old i got attacked in town from behind choc grabbed his leg which i demanded he let him go

Obviously i got upset as these are my loved ones ....i never received the paper work for classification untill the next month in April which i tried Contacting as i spoke to her on the 24/02/23 when i picked up milo from the pound (i was told it was going to be \$780 before they would release him to me but i argue that i had spoken to somebody from Animal control prior to that and they said i would just pay the registration fee and the days he spent in the pound even though Milo needed pet care after being in there 3days he spewed up some cloths or something.

So i rang a friend and she talked to because i was stressed out and told i would only be paying couple hundred dollars not \$780

So after i left with milo only paying \$198 Milo was stink and very Scared like he was traumatized but there was still no mention of choc or milo being classified as Menacing WHY

Im thinking is because Animal control are upset i never had to pay the vet bill for my dog milo being sick while in their care why they have brought this Menacing classification about
