Staff responded to questions from Elected Members concerning proof of the incident and measures taken by the owner to prevent future incidents.

- c) notes under the <u>Dog Control Act 1996</u> that the Dog Control Hearings Panel in determining any objection can only either:
  - i. uphold the classification;
  - ii. bring forward the date of termination of the classification; or
  - iii. immediately terminate the disqualification;
- d) classifies the dog owner as disqualified until 27 October 2027 from the date of the third infringement offence(s) in respect of which the person is disqualified and notes the right of the dog owner to appeal to the District Court under section 27 of the Dog Control Act 1996; and
- e) approves the release of the above resolution to the public via the open minutes of the meeting.
