1. Apologies – Tono aroha

2. Confirmation of Agenda – Whakatau raarangi take

3. Declarations of Interest – Tauaakii whaipaanga

No members of the Panel declared a Conflict of Interest.

4. Confirmation of the Dog Control Hearings Panel Open Minutes 21 February 2024

That the Dog Control Hearings Panel confirm the Open Minutes of the Dog Control Hearings Panel Meeting held on 21 February 2024 as a true and correct record.

5. Objection to Dangerous Classification – Thompson

Ms Thompson spoke to her objection of the classification of her dog Kaiwhai as Dangerous. She outlined the incident in question from her point of view and explained the history she had with a neighbour and their barking concerns. She explained that she has taken steps to block the view from the driveway and that she has seen a reduction in her dog's barking. Elected Members asked questions around ownership history, the day in question, confirmation of a barrier that has been added at the bottom of the gate and additional online training provide for the dog.

The Animal Education & Control Manager took their report as read. They highlighted the previous history of the dog which led to the menacing classification being given. They responded to Elected Member questions concerning the history of the dog, the classification and the behaviour the dog displayed on the day in question.

6. Objection to a Menacing classification – Hockley

Mr Hockley spoke to his objection of the classification of his dog Marlin as Menacing. He outlined the events that led up to the day in question. He spoke to the poor treatment that the dog was subjected to by a previous owner and how this contributed in his view to the aggression the dog displayed to Animal Education & Control Officers on the day in question. Elected Members asked questions around the dog's previous history and owners and what efforts have been done to socialise the dog.

The Animal Education & Control Manager took their report as read. They highlighted the aggression that was displayed towards the officer and the history of roaming behaviour the dog has. Elected Members asked questions concerning the ownership of the dog and requirements of a menacing classification.
