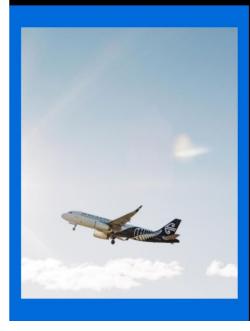

- Service commences 18 September.



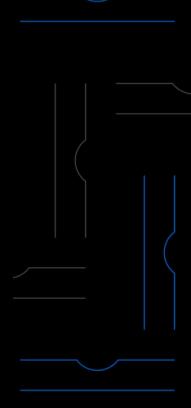

- Central Government.

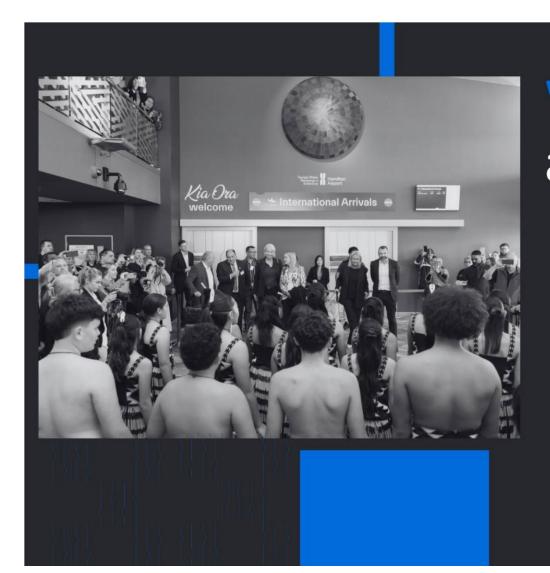
WRAL is receiving an updated legal review.
