I agree to meet all the requirements of the Hamilton City Council Animal Nuisance Bylaw 2013 and all other relevant legislation.

I also agree to comply with the following minimum standards:

- All roosters must be effectively confined within an enclosure appropriate for the number of birds, the size and breed.
- Ensure that there is soundproof enclosure on the property that can be utilised to eliminate or reduce the noise of the birds that may cause nuisance to neighbouring residents. Ensure that this soundproof enclosure is used as needed to ensure the bird/s do not create a nuisance to neighbouring residents.
- All enclosures must be a least 1 meter from the boundary fence and 5 meters from any road or public land.
- The Enclosure must be regularly cleaned.
- The Enclosure must be constructed and maintained to prevent vermin.
- The rooster/s must be kept so it does not cause a noise, odour or fly nuisance.

Advice notes:

Hamilton City Council recommends you talk to your neighbours and let them know you are getting a rooster so they can contact you if they have any concerns.

If a rooster permit is breached, it may be revoked, that would mean that you would be given a set period of time to remove the rooster from your residence. If you fail to comply with this request, escalated enforcement action could be undertaken by Hamilton City Council.

If Hamilton City Council has been to your property before to discuss concerns about nuisance arising from the keeping of rooster/s, you may be required to obtain written consent from all your neighbours when obtaining a permit. Staff will contact you after you have made the application if this is required.

We will contact you if we need further information to make a decision on your application.
