



Cars

Of those who have access to all modes of transport, cars/ vans are the most used mode of transport.



Walking

Walking is the next most frequently used mode of transport, with 66% walking as a mode of transport at least several times in a week.



Bikes and scooters

Significantly more people are using push bikes or electric bikes (30% cf. 21% Dec 2022) and using push scooters or electric scooters (36% cf. 11% Dec 2022) as a means of transport.



Public transport

There is a notable increase in the proportion of those who use public transport on a weekly basis. In Dec 2021, only 12% used public transport on a weekly basis compared to 29% in 2023.
