Kia Ora,

I refer to your **information request below**, Hamilton City Council is able to provide the following response.

Your Request

1. Hamilton's current city population
2. Hamilton City's boundaries, land area. Is it true we have the smallest city boundary of any city in NZ?
3. When we are next able to buy land to develop from surrounding councils
4. How many new build permits in suburbs HCC has over 2021 so far.
5. Whether HCC is seeing more applications for consent for repurposing CBD (Central City) buildings to multi-use developments - i.e. a mix of residential, retail, hospitality, professions/businesses. If so, are there any numbers/statistics I can access.

Our Response

1. Hamilton City's current population is 176,500.
2. The current Hamilton City Boundary is 11,093 Ha. Hamilton City has the smallest city boundary of an "urban" Territorial Authority.
3. At this time, HCC has not resolved to purchase any land from any adjoining Councils. However, through the review of our urban growth strategy, an action to strategically purchase land for community or related uses may be recommended.
4. Please see the table below which shows the total number of new Dwellings consented for 2021 (as at 15/06/2021) for Statistical Area 2 boundaries (suburbs).

5. Council has recently approved consent to convert the WSP Opus office building on Harwood Street into 22 apartments and ground level retail/hospitality tenancies, and consent to create visitor accommodation of 100 rooms from the Tower Building above Centre Place. However, we do not have sufficient data to suggest a trend towards repurposing buildings in the CBD.

Overall, we have seen an increase in resource consent applications received for developments in the central city. This includes a range of new office buildings, apartment buildings and ground level retail/hospitality premises. There are a number of buildings currently being constructed in the city, which include Union Square, Project Hauata, Waikato Regional Council and the Regional Theatre.


