I refer to your **information request below**, Hamilton City Council is able to provide the following response.

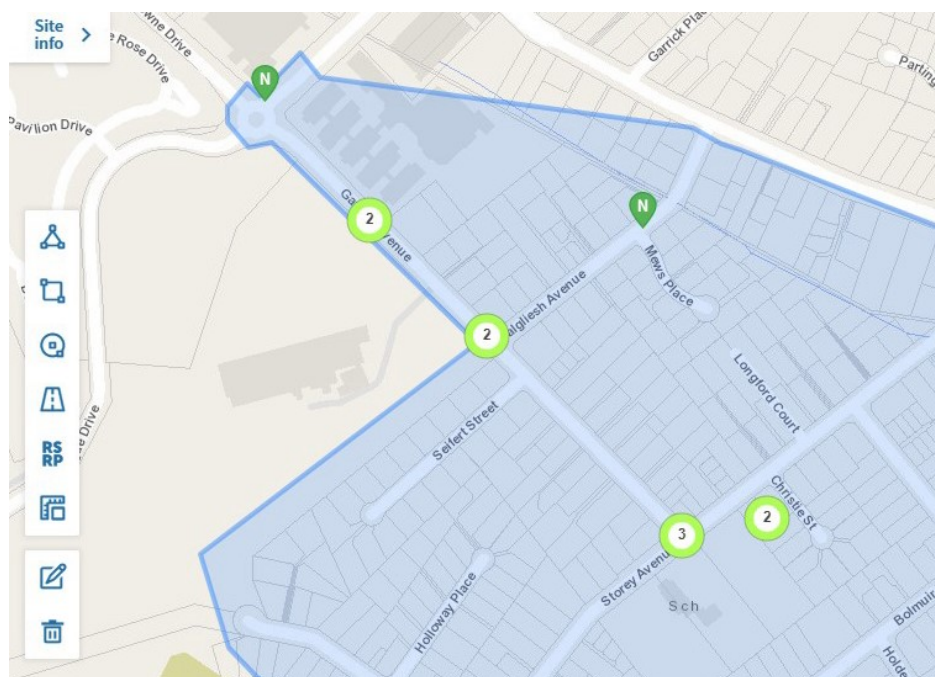
Further to your email received on Wednesday 10 August 2022 requesting a breakdown of records for any vehicle incidents on Storey Avenue, and a summary of communications received by the Council from any resident of Storey Avenue about vehicular activity on Storey Avenue in the last five years, please see Hamilton City Council's response below and attached.

Request one:

Details of all records, whether in hard copy or digital form, in the possession of the Council or to which the Council has had regard which give details of any vehicular incident happening on Storey Avenue in the last 5 years from today's date that cause any personal injury or any property damage with a repair cost of in excess of \$2,500.

Response one:

Hamilton City Council utilises information supplied by Waka Kotahi NZ Transport Agency. A public link to the information is available [Crash Analysis System \(CAS\) data](#). Below is a crash map sourced from this link showing crashes reported from 2017 to 2022. Full details of the incidents and the cost of damages are not available.



A total of 17 crashes are shown - 14 are non-injury (green key), three resulted in moderate injuries.

Request two:

A summary of communications received by the Council in the last 5 years from today's date from any resident of Storey Avenue complaining about vehicular activity on Storey Avenue.

We have been advised by the roading section of the Council that changes are required to Storey Avenue for safety purposes. The proposed changes will remove much of the parking used by members of the community who use the premises. Those members include senior citizens 7(2)(a)

and mothers carrying babies and young children. Staff from the roading section have been asked about the nature of the safety concerns but have declined to give responses. I am writing to make an official information request for the following:

- details of all records, whether in hard copy or digital form, in the possession of the Council or to which the Council has had regard which give details of any vehicular incident happening on Storey Avenue in the last 5 years from today's date that cause any personal injury or any property damage with a repair cost of in excess of \$2,500;
- a summary of communications received by the Council in the last 5 years from today's date from any resident of Storey Avenue complaining about vehicular activity on Storey Avenue. I do not require any information which would cause a breach of The Privacy Act, merely a summary of number of complaints and the general nature of the complaint.

The attached petition is supported and signed by residents and employees who are in the area of Storey Ave in Forest Lake, Hamilton.

We are all seriously concerned about the speed at which an increasing number of vehicles are driven along Storey Ave in both directions. We accept that traffic will pass along Storey Ave to access various parts of Hamilton, but this being a residential area the speed needs to be controlled by some additional means.

Speed humps are an option, but many are not convinced that they are the best option. Realignment of kerbing to narrow the street width in places and designation of 40kph maximum speed may be helpful. It seems clear that the Council street safety staff would have some proven options. Many of us residents would be pleased to meet and discuss options to develop a plan.
