Kia ora,

We refer to your information request **322033/2023**, submitted on 20/04/2023, about information relating to Hamilton waste production, processing and disposal.

Please see the responses below and attached.

Response:

- The total volume of waste in tonnes from all sources produced in Hamilton over the past 10 years (a lesser number of years is acceptable) presented at a City Council (Waste Management and Minimisation Plan (WMMP) level.**

Please find attached the latest approved Waste Management and Minimisation Plan (2018-2024 Plan). The 2024-2030 Waste Management and Minimisation Plan is currently under development.

Below is a breakdown of all kerbside and transfer station tonnage data that is available for the last 10 completed calendar years.

- Please note that Hamilton City Council changed service provider and service levels for kerbside collection on 31 August 2020. This saw the household kerbside service change to 1 x 120L Refuse Wheelie Bin fortnightly, 1 x 240L Recycling Wheelie Bin fortnightly, 1 x 40L Glass Crate collected fortnightly and 1 x 23L Food Waste Bin collected weekly.
- Food waste collection started on 31 August 2020. Food waste is composted.
- Since 31 August 2020 Hamilton City Council's kerbside refuse tonnage goes through Enviro Waste's Sunshine Ave Transfer Station and is separate from the public and commercial refuse tonnes shown at the Lincoln Street Resource Recovery Centre from this date.
- Greenwaste from Hamilton Organic Centre is composted.
- Lincoln Street Resource Recovery Centre refuse tonnes were not provided to Hamilton City Council prior to 31 August 2020.
- There are two private transfer stations in Hamilton - Enviro Waste's Sunshine Ave Transfer Station and Waste Management's Wickham Street Resource Recovery Centre. Hamilton City Council does not have tonnage information for these sites and if you wish to obtain them you would need to approach those parties.

- The split of total waste as a percentage and in tonnes produced by Municipal Waste (MSW), Commercial and Industrial (C&I) and Construction and Demolition (C&D) as a time series for the past 10 years (a lesser number of years is acceptable) at a Hamilton City Council level.**

This is not a figure that Hamilton City Council holds. Municipal kerbside refuse tonnage is shown in 1. above.

A breakdown of the 2017 Lincoln Street waste from the Solid Waste Analysis Protocol (SWAP) audit had the below split of waste by source at Lincoln Street:

Kerbside mixed recycling, shown in the response to question three above, is recovered at Enviro Waste Sunshine Ave Material Recovery Facility. Glass is sorted at kerbside and goes directly to reprocessing and does not go through an MRF.

7. The proportion of total waste that is disposed in a landfill vs is recovered/redirected/repurposed.

Please refer to the answer to question one above. Refuse at the Lincoln Street Refuse Transfer Station and from the kerbside collection is landfilled. Recycling, food waste, green waste through the kerbside Lincoln Street Refuse Transfer Station, Hamilton Organic Centre and kerbside collection is recovered, redirected or repurposed.


