RE: JUDICIAL NOTICE, FORMAL NOTICE, IN EQUITY TO CEASE AND DESIST THE DISTRIBUTION AND INSTALLATION OF EMF DEVICES AND ASSOCIATED TECHNOLOGY PROVEN TO CAUSE HARM INCLUDING INJURY, ILLNESS AND DEATH THROUGH REGULAR EXPOSURE TO EXCESSIVE EMR RADIATION.

Your questions:

1. *Where does it say that Councils are exempt from caring about public health?*
2. *What are you going to say to the people with Electro-hypersensitivity that I will present to you?*
3. *Where is the statute that tells you that, when presented with a report of a possible hazard, you are to refer to dubious references instead of taking positive action to assess the nuisance?*
4. *How are you going to explain your failure to act in the public interest?*

Our response:

In response to your previous letter where you raised your concerns similar to the above about public safety in relation to EMF and Electro-hypersensitivity. We explained that cell towers are regulated by the Resource Management Regulations 2016.

We also explained that there are thresholds for these and if they exceed this threshold, then they must acquire a resource consent. These are monitored by our Planning Guidance team.

Further to your claim of public Health, the Ministry of Health have provided information about EMF that you can read here.

In relation to the assertions made in your letter, Council does not accept assertion that it or its Chief Executive has any liability in relation to the matters you raise.
