Kia ora,

We refer to your information request below. Hamilton City Council provides the following response.

Your request:

Please provide the cost of the council's two most recent byelections, and an estimate, if any is available, of what one would cost if required in the current term.

Our response:

A by-election is not something that any Council plans for, but they do happen. Hamilton City Council has had one during each of the last two terms due to the passing of Councillors. It runs the same as triennial local elections, the same rules apply.

If an Elected Member resigns or passes away or is removed from office the vacancy is known as an extraordinary vacancy and a by-election would be called at that point.

If an extraordinary vacancy occurs more than 12 months before the next triennial election, the Council is legislatively required to hold a by-election. This must be done normally within 89 days of the Electoral Officer receiving notice of the extraordinary vacancy. However, if an extraordinary vacancy occurs in the period 28 September to 20 November 2023, a by-election cannot occur any earlier than 17 February 2024.

The 2017 by-election for the East Ward cost approximately \$92,000.00 and the 2020 by-election for the West ward cost approximately \$122,500.00. An estimated cost for a 2023/24 East or West Ward by-election is \$140,000 (note this estimate was received earlier this year and may be impacted by NZ Post price increases to bulk mail delivery that took effect from 1 July 2023). These costs do not include communication and engagement spend (which is a budget that would need to be established at the time a by-election is held by Council) or staff time.


