Kia ora,

We refer to your information request below. Hamilton City Council provides the following response.

Your request:

*Where am I able to find the information related to how dog registration funds are spent each year by the HCC?
As a responsible dog owner that has spent a significant amount of time making sure I have a well-trained dog and a fully fence property. I really struggle to see how these funds are being spent in any way to benefit myself or my dog's day to day life in the Hamilton.
From the bullet points on the HCC website it's would appear that most of what I am paying for is all the people that do not register, train, fence or look after there dogs properly? How is this fair? I appreciate we have dog parks in the city. I haven't changed in the 7 years I have been paying for a registration.*

Our response:

Dog registration covers a broad range of activities related to dog control and education across our city, such as investigating all dog complaints. Animal Control staff investigated almost 7,000 complaints in the 2022-2023 financial year and we are well on the way to surpassing that number for the 2023-2024 year. It also covers the costs related to maintaining our pound facility, fleet of vehicles and costs associated with the care and welfare of the animals in our pound.

The [Long Term Plan](#) outlines the funding sources for our activities at a high level. You will see in the table below that Animal Control (which is all animal complaints/management including dogs) that we aim to fund between 20-40% of this activity from general rates (this is because there is a public good/benefit aspect to managing animals) and the balance of between 40-60% from fees (infringement revenue and registration fees)
