The panel was to be initiated on a "as needed" basis. At the time of writing this there have been no new permanent public art or memorial art applications that would require the specialist panel.

3. **Please describe actual outcomes & source of funding i.e. gifted.**

In terms of your query on outcomes, as the proposed Integration of Art in Infrastructure Policy has not yet been drafted, we are unable to identify its outcomes.

If your source of funding query is regarding policy development, work to develop the Policy is to be funded through our general rate. However, if it is about the art itself, this would be determined on a case-by-case basis and may include a community funding contribution.

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4. **What is the estimated cost & hours for the policy review?**

Staff are working on the directives contained in 14.g.h.i.k. A survey has been sent to previous event permit recipients seeking feedback on their experience. We are unable to comment regarding the Hamilton Arts Festival and the cost of TTMP: That action is the responsibility of the festival organisers not HCC.

Staff are currently working on an agreed approach to assessment and reporting of costs associated with a policy development or review.

5. **Re 14.g.h.i.k. (arts & event red tape), please refer Chris Williams submission to the LTP re the Hamilton Arts Festival & the costs of Temporary Traffic Management Plans plus the Coalition Government's new policy insisting review & reduce costs (orange cones etc) - what action (if any) have staff taken in response?**

Hamilton City Council has started investigations into the implications of moving away from the current Code of Practice for Temporary Traffic Management (COPTTM) to the new NZ Guide for Temporary Traffic Management (NZGTTM) and is working with the NZ Transport Agency Waka Kotahi and industry representatives to understand the rollout across the country. This includes understanding training needs for staff involved with assessing and approving the proposed temporary traffic management plans.

The NZGTTM will take a more 'risk based' approach and will not rely as heavily on standardised approaches to traffic management. This is a primary difference compared to the current approach from COPTTM.

Each worksite or event will be assessed considering the location, vehicle, pedestrian, and cyclists' movements and determine the temporary traffic management required to ensure everyone is kept safe. For events, proactive temporary traffic management will remain as a requirement.
