We refer to your information request below. Hamilton City Council provides the following response.

Your request:

Sir, may I enquire what the Coleraine playground project funding is costing please?

Our response:

The playgrounds renewals programme was approved by the Community & Natural Environment Committee on 10 September 2024. This programme allocated budget of \$341,200 to complete the renewal of the Rototuna Park Playground.

The budget is expected to cover costs associated with design, removal of old equipment, new equipment purchases and installation and includes a contingency sum. Final costs cannot be confirmed until after delivery is complete. As per the direction received by the Community and Natural Environment Committee, the Playgrounds Working Group will be considering level of service improvements (shade and path connections) which may be added at a later date and will have additional cost.
