Kia ora,

We refer to your information request below. Hamilton City Council provides the following response.

Your request:

1. *How much debt has the Council had at the end of the last financial year?*
2. *What is the Council's current maximum limit for debt?*
3. *Does the Council has intentions (for example plans, drafts, resolutions, discussions) to increase the amount of debt in the future? And if yes, by how much in what timeframe?*
4. *How many people live in the area that the Council manages?*
5. *From how many rating units does the Council collect rates?*

Our response:

1. **How much debt has the Council had at the end of the last financial year?**

\$723 million. Refer to Note 30 of the 2022-23 Annual Report 2022-23 available from the HCC website. 2. **What is the Council's current maximum limit for debt?**

Per Annual Report 2022-23 Disclosure Statement, page 262. The quantified limit is that the debt to revenue ratio will remain below 300% in 2022, 295% in 2023, 290% in 2024, 285% in 2025 and 280% thereafter.

3. **Does the Council has intentions (for example plans, drafts, resolutions, discussions) to increase the amount of debt in the future? And if yes, by how much in what timeframe?**
